After many concerts, tours, and recordings in France and throughout Europe, Michelle has returned to her native United States. In 2018, Ms. Giglio performed live music with the nationally known Sarasota Ballet at the Joyce Theatre in New York City as well as at the Sarasota Opera House. The New York Times stated that Ms. Giglio "sang with beauty and eloquence." In 2013, she was named a semi-finalist in the Concert Artists Guild Victor Elmaleh Young Artists Competition in New York City. Michelle has sung

numerous local concerts with the Sarasota Orchestra, GloriaMusicae, now known as "Choral Artists of Sarasota", Key Chorale, Artist Series of Sarasota, Anna Maria Orchestra & Chorus as well as the Sarasota Ballet. In November 2019 Michelle performed as part of the "Chopin Project" with the Artist Series Concerts of Sarasota. In France Ms. Giglio performed with both the Orchestre National de France and the Orchestre Philharmonique de France, in addition to frequent live appearances on France Musique (French national classical music station). Recordings include: *Iphigénie en Taurride* by Gluck with Les Musiciens du Louvre/Orchestre Chambre de Grenoble on the Deutsche Grammophon label, (Archiv) Marc Minkowski, Conductor and *Chichester Psalms* on the Erato label with the Orchestre Philharmonique de France. Ms. Giglio also performed on Celine Dion's album *S'il suffisait d'aimer*, Sony records as well as in William Klein's film *Messiah*.

Tech Trek

AAUW Florida sponsors a summer camp (Tech Trek) for rising 8th grade girls which focuses on Science, Mathematics, and Technology.

This year Tech Trek camps (two of them) will be held at Stetson in Deland and FAU in Boca Raton. The camps are for different content areas and are not repeated. The students will stay in the schools' dorms for the week.

As in past years, I (Leiland) will be reaching out for volunteers to interview our applications in February.

The following information is a timeframe for the Tech Trek selection process:

- Principals with Sarasota middle schools, public and private, have been sent the nomination information and asked to share it with the STEM area teachers of 7th graders. Please note that although Venice is part of Sarasota County public schools, they have their own AAUW chapter independent of the Sarasota branch. I am reaching out to the schools only in our branch area.
- Teachers will submit nominations online using the website provided. The letter has a link to a short video for teachers about the nomination process. You can view it at:

- Each school can only nominate 5 girls for Tech Trek Camp. The girls must currently be in seventh grade.
- Nominations are due by December 15.
 After nominations are made, applications are sent out.

- The Tech Trek Student and Family Coordinator will send the application information directly to the family. An informational Zoom session for families is planned for January 7 at 4pm. A link will be sent.
- Applications will be returned to the Student and Family Coordinator by January 22. Girls will designate their camp preference on their application.
- Information regarding the branch applicants will be sent to each branch by February 1. The guidelines to use during the interview will be sent.
- Branch coordinator (Leiland) will establish a review committee and use the guidelines provided to interview and rank applicants from their area.
- All interviews should be completed and rankings sent to Student and Family Coordinators by March 6. Your rankings are very important in the selection process.
