Once you can do this, the "Personal Snapshot" screen appears. It has your name, address etc. Click on "My Memberships" in the menu on the left. You will have a chance to review and revise your contact information.

You might see a screen that says National dues are \$67 or \$72... but just keep going. You will need to select **Florida** and **Sarasota**: Look under **Branches D-K Category**: our branch is listed as **FL3026-Sarasota Branch Dues**. Keep clicking Next/Continue. You will get to a screen where you can enter your credit card information.

You will get a screen receipt you can print, and you will get an email receipt.



This coming June there will be two in-person Tech Trek camps for girls who will be entering the 8th grade in the fall. The first camp, Sunday, June 11 to Saturday June 17, will be at Stetson University in Deland, Florida. The second camp, held Sunday June 18 until Saturday June 24, will be at Florida Atlantic University in Jupiter. There will be 48 girls at each camp. They will live in campus dorms, eat their meals in the student cafeteria, and use the University classrooms and labs for their core classes and workshops. The core classes and workshops at the camps will be similar but not identical.


