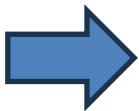

Our Tech Trek Coordinator, Leiland Theriot, will be "retiring" her role at the end of this school year. We are looking for someone to replace her. Most of the work is via email. Here are the activities:

Sept-December 15: Send out Principal and Teacher letters to all available middle school principals. Leiland usually starts sending the first invite in late September and continues to update the principals about every other week or so, letting everyone know how many nominations have been received from each school (info she gets from Sue Slone, FL AAUW coordinator). Leiland has a distribution list of the principals' email addresses.

Dec-January 31: Nominated students go online to complete their applications. Leiland usually follows up with Sue Slone to be sure that all nominated students get their applications done.

February: Applicants will interview with our AAUW Branch volunteers, two AAUW members for each interview. In the past we have scheduled this to happen in person at the Gulf Gate Library study rooms or via Zoom. Leiland can show you how to set this up. Leiland then ranks the results from the nomination, application, and interviews and forwards that to Sue Slone.

We usually find out who made it in March.

Nursing has always been my passion, my dream. I’ve always been a person who enjoyed problem solving. Nursing gives me the opportunity to become a solution to a person’s health problems, as well as make a difference in their life. I can’t count how many times I’ve been complimented at work for always coming in with a positive attitude, a smile, and exciting energy, even when the workload is heavy, and we’re being slammed at work, I still keep my head up and keep a smile on my face. It gives me great pleasure that those attributes about myself don’t go unnoticed. I’m currently an LPN, and I chose to continue my education to become an RN because I know the satisfaction and enjoyment I feel will only be amplified, especially working in a hospital setting. One of my biggest challenges for myself would be not becoming a statistic of my environment. I come from a family of seven, being raised by our grandmother due to our parents battling drug and alcohol addiction. I’ve worked hard to work my way out of a poverty-stricken environment. I’m hardworking, dedicated, and have a true passion for being a nurse. I remember having a patient on hospice; she was one of the sweetest women I had yet to meet at my current facility. She was declining rapidly, and her body was destroying itself from the inside out. No matter what, this woman was funny, sweet, and would always tell jokes. One day her sickness started to really take over, and she started plummeting. I immediately got EMS to the facility so they could transfer her to the hospital. This patient was on her deathbed and still to this day I remember vividly how this woman called out my name in a room full of medical professionals, begging me to help her. That day, and patients like her confirmed I’m in the correct field and I need to keep going with my career. I’d first like to extend my sincerest thank you to all the donors and committee members involved with selecting me to be awarded with this scholarship. This scholarship will help with books, uniforms, clinical, and/or towards tuition. With this scholarship I have security that I don’t have to choose between school or my transportation, or between school or being homeless. With this Scholarship I’m able to study without distractions, and I’m able to cut back on my work hours to focus on my course work. I’m very grateful to be a recipient of this award because having my finances secured for school put me in a better position to receive a proper education without the stressors of life weighing me down.

Please explain why you are pursuing the course of study that you have chosen. In your response, consider how your chosen course of study reflects your life’s journey thus far and your personal and professional aspirations for your future.

When I was 16 years old, I did not know what I wanted to do with my life, like most teenagers that age. In my experience, I did not make the best decisions and ended up in a situation where I was vulnerable, scared, and helpless. I felt like my life was over, and I felt that I was not worthy of having

the good fortunes others did. In the midst of this happening, there was someone there that helped me regardless of why I was brought to the hospital nor who I was, and that was my nurse. I admired the compassion she showed to a total stranger, and the comfort that her presence brought me in my time of need. When I asked her if she thought I would be able to become a nurse, she told me that I could achieve this if I set my mind to it, and that I could be a great nurse if I wanted to pursue it. After this scare in my life, I dedicated myself to studying and doing my best in school, and with the guidance and help of my school principal and a dear teacher and friend now, I won the award of Most Improved Student of our class, was able to graduate on time, and enroll into our community college, SCF, while also receiving my certificate as a nursing assistant and working full time hours as a Certified Nursing Assistant in Sarasota Memorial Hospital. My love for Nursing grew with being a CAN; even the smallest gestures can mean the world to someone. Anyone that has gone through nursing school knows the struggles we endure as students, the amount of work, dedication, focus, and love you need to have for your profession to succeed and pass.
