
President's Message



Write Read Write Program

Each year many of our members generously offer to buy a book for a third-grade student at an underserved school. As with last year, Alta Vista Elementary School is that school; and this year we have two classrooms (of about 20 in each) to buy for.

This is how our Sarasota Branch describes the program in our Education Initiatives.

The Write Read Write program targets 3rd grade students who write a letter describing themselves and/or their reading interests. These student letters are distributed to our branch members who individually purchase a book appropriate for that student. The books are delivered to their teacher for distribution. After reading the book, the student writes a note describing how they enjoyed the book. That note is then returned to the AAUW member who provided the book.

On Wednesday, the 13th, I had the opportunity to speak to the two classes. What a joy seeing their enthusiasm and hearing their questions. I will be collecting the names of the students **next week!** I know that everyone will want to participate again. So, I am asking you now to *please send me a quick email saying YES.* My email address is suemcg4802@gmail.com You will be asked to buy one hardcover book, write a letter describing who you are (They were very interested in knowing something about who would be buying a book for them!), and write the letter IN PRINTED FORM ONLY.* You will receive your child's letter in early in January, and we will collect your books and letters at the February 21 meeting at the North County Library. Later in the spring you will receive a thank you note from your student.

Assisting this year in the distribution and collection of the letters and books are Bev Prechtel, Anne Salamone, Kathy Oarr, and Carol Bernasconi.

Because I speak from the experience of many of us, we know that this is a terrific program; and we love to get those thank you notes! Please join us again this year (and if you haven't had the opportunity to in the past, this is a great time to begin!). Thank you.
