


Black History Music Through the Ages

Tresident's Message



The AAUW Florida Public Policy Committee has selected four bills to support and one to oppose for the current legislative session that began January 9. You may not read about these bills in the news, but they have been crafted to make the lives of women easier in Florida. Please contact your state legislators to give your opinion–position papers are available on the AAUW Florida website: <u>https://aauwadvocacyflorida.blog/2024/01/10/florida-2024-legislative-session/</u> After stating that you are a constituent, you may use the AAUW Florida name (I stand with AAUW Florida on this bill.) or just write a short note in support/opposition with your name.

ERA Bills: SCR142/H647: The 14th Amendment to the US Constitution does not prohibit discrimination on the basis of sex in the same way it does for race or national origin. We need this protection now.

Pregnant Women in Custody: SB 100/HB 237: After a pregnancy test on their request, every arrested female would be allowed to petition for a postponement, but not a reprieve, of incarceration. Jail is no place for healthy pregnancy and delivery.

Paid Parental Leave for State Career Service Employees: SB 127/HB 128: This bill changes unpaid to paid leave for the over 80,000 employees of the State of Florida, who are paid an average of \$56,500 per year.

Pregnancy Support and Wellness Services: SB 256/HB 343: This bill would improve the integrity of the state-supported childbirth-only Pregnancy Support Centers by requiring that information presented be medically correct and requiring Department of Health inspections and annual audit reports.

Employment and Curfew of Minors HB49 The AAUW Florida opposes bills aiming to enable employers to hire 16-year-olds without time or job restrictions (HB49/SB1596), because of the supreme importance of a good education in lifting people out of poverty.

The Freedom to Learn Act S1414/HB1355 The Freedom to Learn Act would repeal or amend many of the provisions of previously passed legislation prohibiting educational materials related to system racism and "identity politics".

Congratulations are in order for our very own Esteph, who recently was awarded national recognition in the boating industry as a 2023 Women Making Waves recipient. In its sixth year and a part of *Boating Industry* magazine's Top 100 Awards her award recognizes Esteph as a Top 30 woman in a male-dominated industry.

Coming from Puerto Rico and always loving the water, Esteph began her career in the boating industry 18 years ago, where she worked for 16 years for a major boating company. Beginning as a receptionist and climbing the corporate ladder as a finance and insurance administrative assistant and personal assistant to top yacht sales professionals, she became a top producing business manager—helping turn around one of the worst performing stores to now one of the top producers in the nation. After 16 years she moved to a privately owned company, improving their finance and insurance (F & I) department and was appointed Director of Finance.

Throughout all these years, Esteph continued her education and two years ago was awarded her master's degree from LSU Shreveport.

To hear Esteph speak, she will admit that achieving success has required effort and perseverance, especially working in such a male-dominated world as the boating industry.
